I further declare that the driver(s) hold a driving licence of the appropriate class and will produce, if required, such a licence and that the driver(s) have read the NTET Traction Engine Code of Practice. I agree to produce, on request, an Inspection certificate in accordance with the IEE regulations for any electrical equipment (i.e. generators, wiring, appliances). I agree to abide by the Code of practice of the National Traction Engine Trust and the Society's written Statement of Safety policy. 1. THERE WILL BE NO ADMISSION AFTER 10AM EACH DAY AS THERE WILL BE NO VEHICLE MOVEMENT ON OR OFF STE DURING THE SHOW (BETWEEN HOURS OF 10AM AND 5PM) DUE TO HEALTH & SAFETY. 2. The Road Traffic Act now applies to places to which the Public have access, therefore a **speed limit of 5mph** will be enforced. 3. All Vehicles/Working machines must be insured against third party risk, including Use off Road and Display Use. 4. Steam Engines must have insurance and boiler inspection certification 5. No unlicensed or under age driving 6. All static exhibits to be Safely Fenced 7. Do Not let dogs run free – they must be on a lead at all times 8. You may arrive from 9am on Friday 27th July. 9. All exhibitors are reminded that they must conform to precaution against fire within any allocated space 10. All persons must pay regard to the Steward's Instructions and should conduct themselves in a manner which, will not inconvenience other persons. 11. All exhibits must be in their display areas by 10am and remain there until 5pm each day. The only vehicle movement will be to travel to and from the Arena. 12. PLEASE NOTE: **NO PASS- NO ENTRY**. 13. If you leave the showground in the evening you must show your vehicle pass upon returning AND Evening Passes (obtained from Security upon Exit) else you will not be allowed re-entry by Security. 14.
